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
The Research Project: Identifying LTRGs across the US to understand their operations

- LTRGs = long-term recovery groups that coordinate mostly donated resources to address unmet needs of disaster survivors
- LTRGs are important for low-income survivors recovery
- There is no a list of all LTRGs that exist or have existed in the US
- We compiled a list of all LTRGs that operated between 2010-2019 in the US to create a database.



Methodology



Results



Many LTRGs, mostly informal groups, in urban counties

- 455 LTRGs found
 - 80% serve single counties
 - Only 36% have nonprofit status
 - Missouri has 57, followed by Texas 50

Results

 Counties with LTRGs: had higher disaster damages

- Had larger populations
- Had slightly higher overall social vulnerability scores, indicating greater social vulnerability

Impact to Public: Better LTRGs that Speed Recovery

- LTRGs are becoming increasingly common
- But communities first forming one are often confused and need support



- Database provides access to peers for learning
- Research results and team's expertise also provide guidance on LTRG structure and operations



- Improved LTRG operation will reduce recovery time for most needy survivors and ensures better use of donated resources
- Faster LTRG formation speeds recovery for survivors
- Improved donor trust and relations
- Reduced confusion for survivors with unmet needs
